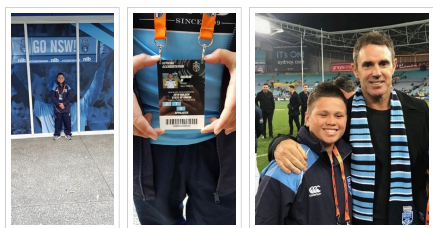

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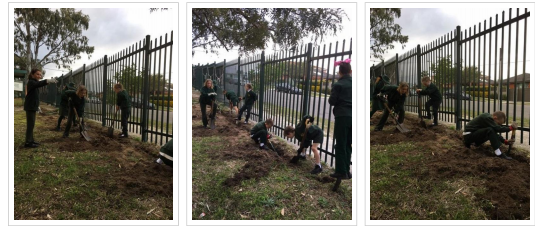

## Kindergarten: Scientists & Engineers

Kindergarten students have been exploring different objects and what makes them move, as part of their Science unit this term. They have been exploring push and pull forces used to move objects, in ways such as sliding, bouncing and spinning, through a series of collaborative inquiry-based learning activities.

Students also had the opportunity to design a toy that moves, by drawing up plans and labelling moving parts, identifying what materials they will use and making the toy from recycled materials.

This week students presented their fantastic, creative toys to the class and also had time to collaboratively investigate, through play, all the ways their toys could move.

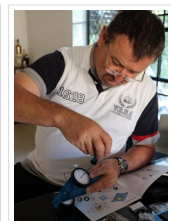

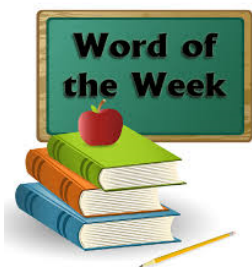
