READING

With the Christmas holiday rapidly approaching... books! Reading is not solely a school based activity and as mentioned on an ongoing basis reading volume is a massive determiner of reading proficiency. Simply, the more we read the more proficient we become.

When reading with your child and finding an unknown word remember to Pause, Prompt and Praise:

- Pause to give your child time to work out the word.
- **Prompt** by asking whether it make sense and trying to sound out the word (if necessary tell your child the word and keep reading in order to maintain the meaning of the text).
- **Praise** your child for trying even if mistakes are made. It all about having a go!

Above all, enjoy reading. It should be fun.

Home Reading Tip:

- Before reading, talk about the cover, the title, the pictures, and discuss what the book may be about.
- During reading, discuss what has been read up to that point, and imagine what will happen next time.
- After reading is finished, talk and ask questions about the story and the pictures.
- When reading a harder book together, take turns.
- Beginning readers can read the repetitive parts and more experienced readers can read a paragraph or a page.

• The **community library** next to the Mitchell St carpark is for everyone to enjoy. The books are free to borrow and can be returned, kept or exchanged for another book. Enjoy and happy reading!
